# To attend preschool in one of our schools, you must be an Academy District 20 resident.

#### **Application Process**

- Return the attached application indicating your choice of school and class with the \$55.00 non-refundable application fee (payable to Academy School District 20).
- Applications for the 25-26 school year will be made available on the district website, beginning on January 17. Applications received Jan. 17 Feb. 14, 2025 will be reviewed through a lottery system until capacity is reached. Selected applicants will be notified by March 31, 2025. Remaining applications will be added to a wait list. We will continue to accept applications after Feb. 14, however, these will also be added to the wait list.
- **Do not** complete the online registration process until you have been notified by letter of your child's preschool placement.

#### Requirements

- All preschool students must be independent with toileting skills.
- Children must be 3 years of age by October 1, 2025, and be 3 years of age before starting preschool.

#### **Tuition**

- Tuition is \$260.00 per month. Tuition is for four half days per week, Monday through Thursday. Each session is approximately 3 hours a day.
- Payments are due on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of each month. (No invoices are sent out.)
- Billing begins in September and runs through May. Additional school fees will be determined by each location and are the responsibility of each family.
- Fees are contingent upon Board of Education approval as part of the district wide fee schedule and could change.

#### **Other Considerations**

If your child has an Individualized Education Plan or you have concerns about your child's development, please call our preschool office at 719-234-1750.

If your child is selected to attend our preschool, you will need the following information to register:

- Verification of residency
